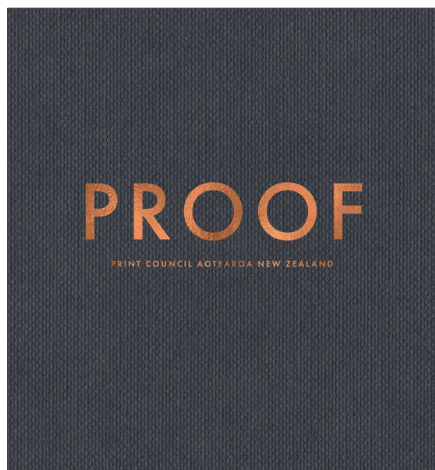

 when I started out.

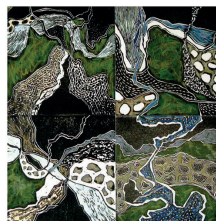

 produce a textural quality with bold use of colour and line.

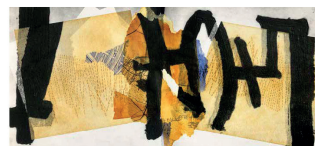
