

Dr Tracey Slaughter is a poet and short story writer. She is the author of seven books, including: the girls in the red house are singing (Te Herenga Waka University Press, 2024), Devil's Trumpet (Te Herenga Waka University Press, 2021) and the award-winning novella if there is no shelter (Ad Hoc, 2020). She has been widely anthologised and has received numerous awards, including the international Bridport Prize (2014), BNZ Katherine Mansfield Awards in 2004 and 2001, the Manchester Poetry Prize in 2023 and the Calibre Essay Prize in 2024. Her short story collection, Deleted Scenes for Lovers, was acclaimed as 'note-perfect' (Spinoff) and 'intoxicating . . . self-assured, forceful' (Listener). In 2014 she established the literary journal Mayhem. She lives in Kirikiriroa Hamilton and teaches creative writing at the University of Waikato.
